#### **List of repertoires of composers born before 1950 for consideration**

Becoming well versed in the canon of Western Art Music is essential to the development of a composer's ability, both in compositional skill and compositional thought. Below is a partial list of repertoires that is essential for a composer's knowledge and reference. Its presentation begins with the earliest examples to the modern day (until composers born after 1950). Publishers are indicated for each work.

Only notated compositions are listed, however incomplete the notation is. The struggle to wrestle sound into a visual codification for interpretation has been an essential aspect of what music composition is and, in turn, reveals fundamental aspects of a composer's thought.

As much composed music has been stage or vocal music, it is particularly important to pay attention to the literature that a composer relies upon and how it is incorporated into the musical context.

A final caveat regarding this list of repertoires is the underrepresentation of women composers and composers of color which hopefully can be corrected as more underrepresented composers born before 1950 are discovered.
